 "Folk artists have been designing furniture out of twigs for a very long time," says Gleysteen. The stairway's banister, by artisan Crispin Shakeshaft, is made of Eastern white cedar twigs with a cherry railing, and took 14 months to complete. "Each of the components that define the room has a rhythm and scale to it," Gleysteen says. "Everything goes together like a good musical composition."
